ITINERARY

"Orange County Day for the N. E. A."

June 29, 1926

Arrive Santa Ana, Cal., chief city and county seat of Orange County, morning of June 29 on special train from San Diego.

Breakfast at St. Ann's Inn, between 6th and 7th Streets, on Broadway, from 7 to 8:30 o'clock.

9 A. M. Motor to Newport Beach and Balboa. Pleasure beach and yacht harbor and Orange County's commercial harbor in the making.

10 A. M. Along beautiful stretch of sea-coast over South Coast Highway to Huntington Beach. Drive thru rich oil district.

10:45 A. M. To Garden Grove, center of world's chili pepper production.

11:15 A. M. Thru citrus and walnut groves to the thriving city of Orange, around tropical circular plaza. To foothills and Orange County's 160-acre natural mountain park.

12 Noon. Luncheon, barbecued ham and trimmings. Official welcome. Spanish entertainers. Rest 'neath the classic oaks.

2 P. M. Leave Orange County Park. Scenic views from foothill grade. Pacific ocean and Catalina Island in distance. Back thru towns of El Modena, Villa Park (largest lemon packing house in state) Olive, Richfield, Yorba Linda, Placentia to city of Anaheim.

3 P. M. To Valencia orange grove of Charles C. Chapman, in the Fullerton-Placentia district. Pick "Old Mission" oranges off the trees in Mr. Chapman's pioneer "Home Ranch" grove. Short talk on citrus industry by County Farm Advisor before entering grove. Photographs.

4:30 P. M. To city of Fullerton. Entrain for Los Angeles.

(NOTE:—If time permits the party will visit the oil fields of Brea, the avocado groves of La Habra, and Buena Park before boarding train at Fullerton.)
