July 21st/64

We had a considerable of a scare here Saturday morning last it was reported that Forrest was marching on us we were ordered out in line of Battle at 3 a.m. and remained so until 10 a m [Page 2 – Letter continued] fell back to camp we were Kept in readiness all day and the Pickets were strongly reinforced but no Enemy appeard [sic].

every morning at 3,30 a.m. and drill until 6,30 a.m. as it is too awful hot to drill in day time this is the first drilling we have done since we left Columbus Indiana.
