Support for the proposed \$10,000 library bonds at the election on August 31 was asked of the Rotary Club by Mrs. L. E. Hilke, chairman of the library board. Miss May Coddington, city librarian, and Mrs. Henry Goodcell, and the club named Joe E. King to have charge of marshalling the forces on election day to insure getting out a good vote. If the city votes \$10,000 in bonds, the Carnegie corporation will give \$7,600 but the building must be completed by next June to secure this donation.
