I feel highly honored to be called upon to assist in these formal opening exercises of the second Valencia Orange Show, an event of no small importance to all our beautiful Southland.

Perhaps no section of the globe can produce a greater variety of both the necessaries and the luxuries of life than Southern California. The divine hand has been lavish in bestowing upon our Southland rare natural advantages, greater perhaps than can be found anywhere else.
