Chapman Announces Homecoming Festivities, Oct. 27-28

Chapman University's Homecoming Festivities Will Include 5K Run, Tours, Football, Fireworks and Dedication of the New Wilson Field on Saturday, Oct. 28

ORANGE, Calif. Chapman Universitys 2006 Homecoming and Family Weekend festivities will include an array of activities for both Chapman alumni (who will be returning to the campus in full force for the celebration) and the general public. Highlights of the two-day celebration Friday and Saturday, Oct. 27-28 will include Chapmans Inaugural 5K Run/Walk, tours of the buildings and campus (including the new Marion Knott Studios, the art-filled Fish Interfaith Center, and a movie-locations tour of Orange), performances by student groups, and the Chapman Panthers vs. Pomona-Pitzer football game, with the halftime dedication of the universitys new Holly and David Wilson Field complete with a fireworks show.

Most events are free and open to the public (the football game/field dedication is \$8 for the general public, \$5 non-Chapman students, \$2 children under 12, and free for Chapman students, faculty and staff with ID).
