Eileen Padberg, Advocate of Iraqi Women, Speaks Sept. 26

Who/What: For more than 25 years, Eileen Padberg has managed public affairs and political campaigns and has also provided strategic planning and corporate communications for some of the top corporations and organizations in the U.S., including several of Orange Countys most prestigious businesses. The Laguna Niguel resident has implemented a groundbreaking program that has provided 64,000 career-development training hours to more than 1,500 Iraqi women, and created a small-business development program that includes a database of more than 300 Iraqi women-owned businesses. At one point, the Iraqi insurgency had a \$300,000 price on her head for being an American woman in Iraq helping with womens rights. The programs she has personally created continue to grow, building Iraqi womens confidence and preparing them for new roles in their emerging nation. The title of her talk is From Baltimore to Baghdad: Women Need Opportunities.
