\$6 Million Gift Names Residence Hall, Two Endowed Chairs

ORANGE, Calif. A \$6 million gift from the Glass Family Foundation to Chapman University has named the university's newest residence hall and will also establish two endowed academic chairs on campus. The Jerrold and Jacqueline Glass Residence Hall was dedicated on Thursday, March 30 with a ceremony that included a speech by Chapman president James L. Doti and one of the residence halls students, a performance by Chapman singers, and showers of confetti.

The 312-bed state-of-the-art hall, which includes both traditional dorm rooms and 2-bedroom apartments, is located in the university's residence hall complex on Center Street in Orange, just north of the main campus.

The gift will also establish the Jerrold A. Glass Chair in Finance and the Jacqueline M. Glass Chair in Theatre and Music at Chapman.
