Chapman, UCI Team Up for Mini-Medical School Series

Orange, Calif., January 5, 2005 In an effort to reach out to the Orange County community about various important health related topics, Chapman University's Department of Biological Sciences and UCIs College of Medicine have teamed to create a Mini-Medical School Lecture Series taking place Monday evenings in January at Chapman University. The free series, highlighting current health issues, features two 30-minute lectures from faculty members from each university with a Q and A session following.

We hope that the people in the audience will gain a greater knowledge of various health related topics, said Dr. Virginia Carson, professor of biological sciences. The series also shows that professors at Chapman and UCI have many common research interests.

Chapman and UCI previously worked together on a similar lecture series in January 2003.
