He is an active soloist and has performed at every major campus in Southern California as well as in other states and Austria. He frequently performs in solo recitals at the Franz Liszt Academy, Budapest, Hungary. Since 1987, he gives annual faculty recitals at Chapman University. He is considered a specialist in the music of Franz Liszt and Bela Bartok, featuring their works in his recitals. He has given master classes and has adjudicated numerous piano competitions.
