Dutch soprano Elly Ameling is one of the most celebrated singers of our age, beloved and admired for her splendidly expressive voice and compelling artistry. Her career spanned more than four decades of the twentieth century with performances in every major cultural center of the world.

Her repertoire encompasses a great variety of styles and musical spheres, including opera – notably Mozart – German lied and French *mélodie*. Her remarkable artistry is preserved in some 150 recordings. Few artists have recorded so extensively, providing future generations with an opportunity to hear virtually her entire repertoire.

Since her farewell tour in 1995, she has been in great demand throughout the world for her master classes. Singers and their accompanists are eager to benefit from her dedication to passing on what she knows to aspiring students.
