Washington, le September 5, 1941.

Dear Uncle Dick:

I am pleased to inform you that upon receipt of your letter the Ambassador wired immediately to Vichy stating that as President of the Comité France-Amérique you were interested in having an exit visa granted to Mr. and Mrs. Tymianka, whose son had given his generous assistance to the concert for the benefit of the refugees from Lorraine. I hope we shall receive an answer pretty soon. Should it arrive while I am away one of my colleagues will certainly inform you of its contents.

Should Vichy remain silent in this matter, I suggest that you have Boisanger cable to Mr. Henry-Haye.
