Somewhere in France

Dearest Marjorie -

This is the first chance I've had to get a line to you and it must be brief. I'm fine and things go nicely for all here. I'm now with an evacuated hospital. Have been brutally busy and have had the opportunity to do a host of major surgery and feel that I'm again doing something that really counts.

Had my first night's sleep in a week last night & am rested again. Also got a bath & shave today so I'm a new man again. When you write tell me how the war is going - we're too busy to hear any news!!

Will the family too. I haven't a moment to write them now - I love you dearly - send a kiss for Frank also.
