Sept. 20, 1917

Dear Dorothy.

I want to thank you profusely for that dandy letter you have written me.

You sure are an interest ing writer. How are you now Dot? I also rec'd the magazines your folks sent me, and I feel that I don't deserve such fine treatment, You girls are treating me to good.

Them books sure contain some very interesting stories So far I have not rec'd my "shot" but will receive
