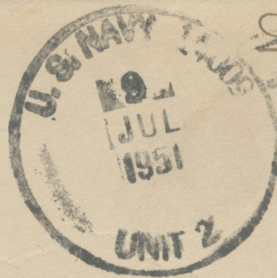

Dear Kids;

Just a short letter here this morning. While I don't have anything else to here. I am not flying this morning we have little trouble with our planes. The boys are working on now. We came in here last night with five planes. Boy it was raining when we left the Stemi. and its still raining here. We saw the stage show last night which was given by the special service boys. and moving picture. Of course the picture was outside in the rain. I just saw half of the picture and left for the sock. Its still raining now.

The planes from Stemi came in little while ago and we got some mail on it. I received your letter of July 1st happy to know that you are in the best of health and also the girls.

I think the planes from Honolulu

in yesterday. because we get the mail and I understand no checks anyway. I hope it be waiting for us when we get back there some time this week end.

I hope you have received the \$15.00 that I send you some time ago. Will sure take care good of the girls. Dont let them get out your sight for anything.

Oh you dont let goldies get all shook up she is just a good friend of my mine. mother of fact she had left the mess hall. They pick out the girls from the mess hall. first of this month.

Will hear there isnt much of anything that I can tell you.

Give my best love to the girls for me. also mother and her son.

Lets call this a letter for now. I send this letter a free mail see how long it take to get there.
