Charlie. I. am glad that the war is over. The war has hurt us a good many thousand Dollars. Charlie about your allotment that you allowed your Mother. she only received one cheque for \$10⁰⁰ which she received the first of September So when they Straiten your account tell. Your Captain how your pay stand so you get all that is Coming to you. we are all well and we had a good time thanksgiven.
