WELL HONEY HOW ARE YOU GETTING ALONG WITH THE GIRLS ARE THEY GOOD? YOU BETTER HAVE THEM TRANS RIGHT OR ELSE I HIT YOU OVER THE HEAD. OR SHALL I HIT IN THE EYE HA HA.

THIS MORNING I PUT MYSELF ON THE LIBERTY LIST AND SIGNED TOO SO IAM GOING OUT THIS AFTERNOON, JUST GOING OUT TO TAKE PICTURES TOO AND YOU BETTER BELEIVE IT TOO. I SHOULD BE BACK SOME TIME TOMORROW NOON MAYBE 11:00 A:M. AND DON'T WORRY ABOUT ANYTHING I KEEP MY PANTS ON BESIDE ITS TOO COLD TO TAKE OFF YOUR PANTS IN THIS PART OF THE COUNTRY IN THIS TIME OF THE YEAR.

OH YES, I JUST FINISHED TYPING A LETTER TO MARY'S OUTFIX, THIS THE FISRT LETTER THAT WROT TO HER THIS YEAR.

THE LIFE FOR ME AT THE PRESENT TIME IS NOT SO HOT AT THE PRESENT I AM GETTING COLD AGAIN, GEE THIS MADE ME SO MAD, I COULD BEEN ALL THE BAD COLD I WANTED WHEN I WAS SLEEPING IN THE SNOW IN KOREA. AND HERE I SLEEP IN NICE WARN BED AND GET BAD COLD.
