Pulaski, Tenn., August 15th, 1864.

My Dear Father

I received a letter from you on Wednesday and another yesterday both written at Norwalk Ohio I also received one from Aunt Clara it takes a letter some eight days to come from Norwalk here while we get letters from St. Madison in two days I am glad you sent to Frank for my clothes I cannot feel so grateful to you for sending me every thing I ask for — Our Regt has been divided up and I think our prospect for going home is very poor indeed now but we may go after all I cannot tell what will be done between now and the 20th of next month the time agreed upon as the starting time Six companies of our Regt are at Decatur Ala now our company still remains here I hope if we do go home next month that we will go through on our horses so we will get to keep them and then these Southern Rail Roads

One very uncertain and we don't know
what time it will be dashed to pieces
Aug 15/64
when on one of these trains.

I am glad you are getting better I hope
your trip will do you good. I will send
this to Mr Madison as I don't know whether
you would get it if I sent to Cornwall and
Salem will forward it on if she thinks
best. George is well and still with
Dr Lewis and gets along very well indeed.
I am well but have lots of work to do
in fact too much the General said yesterday
we might get two more clerks as there was
too much for me to do - I will have to
close as I am very busy and I want
this to go on the next train good Bye
write soon and often I will write in
a day or two again
