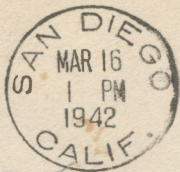

Hello Mom.

Had a funny thing happen yesterday.

I received two letters from home and tho they were dated two days apart they arrived here together. It seems that Uncle Sam has his trouble in handling mail since this war has started. Our Mailman says that the normal mail now from camps exceeds by far the usual Xmas mail and he says that he thinks that by next Xmas the post office crews will be doubled to handle the enormous overload they expect.

Forgot to mention before but I took out Five Thousand dollars worth of insurance and made you the beneficiary. This should take care of you in event that something happens to me. I don't believe anything will but it pays to be prepared. Mary is the alternate beneficiary.

Sorry I can't tell you how I made out with the pistol or the small bore rifle because the sergeant won't tell us



until we are thru firing the 30 Caliber rifle  
Hope that you aren't doing anything to  
make me feel ashamed of you but I trust  
that you have changed and are as nice as  
can be when you want to be. Don't sew too  
much now, because your eyes aren't any too  
strong and you might strain them. Oh Yes.  
Don't forget to put a straight part in your  
hair.

Talking about hair I am one of the few  
fellows in the platoon able to part their  
hair. The rest of them stand around and  
look at us with envy because their hair  
stand straight up. I shave every morning  
with cold water and believe <sup>(me)</sup> that is some  
achievement. Ask Eddie if he would like  
to try it for a couple of weeks.

Rested all day getting ready for our  
final week here at the range. Can't wait  
until we shoot for record. The suspense is  
slowly driving us goofy. Hope we all succeed  
and then go on to try our marksmanship  
in those lousy japs.
