

April 30 – 1918.

Many thanks for it and it surely tasted good It sure seems nice to me to get things that way and it does me good in a place like this I am certainly enjoying myself though. We had a regimental paraide [sic] last sunday [sic] and Varny. Ralph and I were it [sic] it. There were surely lots of people watching us. I am working as clerk in. a canteen now for a while well they sure do a great business there to [*sic*]. The boys tooke [*sic*] a long hike this aftenoon [sic]. and some of them are preety [*sic*] tired from what they say.
