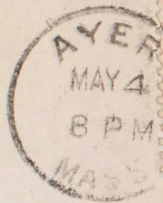

Ayer, Mass. May 14, 1918.

Dear Bro.

Just a few lines to tell you that I have the deed fixed up and am sending it this afternoon from Ayer Mass. a small town near the Camp. I am glad now that I got it fixed up so I can get it off of my hands before I leave.

Say Rob, I am sending a pennant of the Engineers, I thought a souvenir would be all right to send from this place before I leave.

We were paid last night, (Friday) and our Lieutenant gave us some good advice. He told us to hang on to our money, and to buy our soap and tobacco here, because it was hard to get over there, and he said that this was our last payday on this side, so it means that we are going over this Month. This is the first pass that I had since I've been here so I thought I would come to the Federation House and write a few letters.

I received a letter from Gult and he does not know when he will leave, so I might beat him over yet. Well Rob as I am out of

hot air I will close hoping that this finds you
all well.
