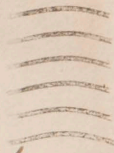
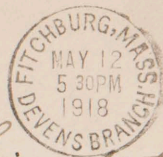

Just a few lines to tell you I received your letter and was glad to hear from you.

I am glad that you have plenty work now. I am surprised that you did not get that pennant yet, I suppose it went astray.

I wonder if you folks sent Amanda one of them photos, for she wrote and told me that she would like to have some kind of a picture from me. Say Rob, will you give her one of them I sent home. Say Rob I am going to send home a picture of the whole Company in a day or two and I think it is a good picture.

Help your Country by Saving. Write on BOTH Sides of this Paper.

It is about 3 ft. long and has
250 men on it.

Say Rob, if you send anything
more to me, I would rather you
would put that ~~money~~ you spend
for cake, into some cheap tobacco,
because I can take tobacco to
France with me where I couldn't
pack cake. We are allowed so
much in our packs so we have
to pack things carefully so we
can take the things we will
most need. Just think a package
of smoking costs 40¢ over there,
that is the limit ain't it?

Well Rob I am going on the
range tomorrow and make a few
bullseyes. Well Rob as everything
is the same here I will close
hoping that all are well.
