Sgt. Scuggs went back to the Barber's Point last week and getting another T/Sgt. in his place some time next week So will kind delay a little me going to the Barber's Point. I am leaving here on the 6 July and I should stay in Honolulu about a week and on to the States.

So much for that part and I sure do hope that I will see you all some time next month by this time too. I heard nothing new on the trouble from the home I hope that I hear some pretty soon too.


