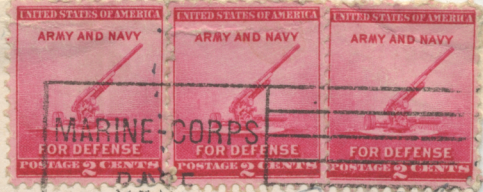

Havent received any mail for the last three days and I am sort of worried. Maybe something has happened at home that I should know about.

Still am in the penk and feeling better than ever. The food has been especially good this week. Had Turkey twice and Rabbit once. Am not putting any weight on because I am not eating very much. The work isn't hard and as a result I have lost my ~~weight~~ appetite.

Went to Vista, Calif. last nite. It is about forty five miles from the base. Steve Dugas has some friends in L.A. and they came and got him & I and took us to their friends ranch at Vista.

It is a beautiful place situated on a hill that overlooks the Ocean. The people there were wonderful to us. We had a delicious steak for supper and all the fruit we could eat.

They raise avocados and oranges on their ranch. They were very friendly and it was the first time since I arrived here that I was actually content.

We met a young girl there &

she gave us her address and told us that whenever we went up to L. A. to let her know and she and her girl friends would show us the town. She was very concerned about our having a good time while we were here.

On our way to Vista we drove on Ocean Drive which runs along the ocean and it was really a sight to see the huge waves rolling up on the beach. Passed Bing & Ship race track, Del Mar, and it is small, but beautiful and the landscape was the prettiest I have ever seen. Also passed Pat O'Brien's home which is situated on a high knoll right

on the ocean front.

Saw my proofs today and they were awful. The photographs here are washed and consequently very few of us get good pictures. And having six of them made but I don't know what I'll do with three of them.
