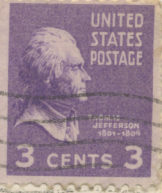

Dear Folks;

Here I am settled at last
We were divided into platoons
and companies today. I am in
the first platoon of Company D
It is a .30 caliber Machine gun
Company. Luckily Steve was
called out to because the
rest of my friends were split
up and are in different platoons

Steve and I are in the
same tent, and there are forty
eight of us in the platoon

We are to undergo a rigid seven week course which will include at least three weeks of field maneuvers. I thought that I might have a chance for a rating but they have transferred enough non sons to complete our platoons. Still I won't quit trying to get ahead because I know that some day my chance will come.

I am contented that I have finally wound up in a combat unit. The camp we are in isn't completed by a long shot. We will probably ~~will~~ work all week getting it in order

It was inhabited by a Army
Regiment but they couldn't take
it so they moved out. Wanted
to see sergt M^o Carthy to night
but they have restricted us for
awhile because two fellows didn't
come back from their leave this
morning.

Expect to get toughened up
running up and down these hills
Had my shirt off fifteen minutes
this morning and was sunburned.
The sun gets awfully hot during
the day but if you get in
the shade it is nice and cool.
The air up here in the

mountains is fresh and invigorating
Makes a person feel like really
working.

We might go to the new
base just outside of L.A. after
our training. Hope so, San Diego
is strictly a lousy town.
