Received your letter dated Aug. 13 + 19 in the last couple of days. Was glad to hear that you enjoyed your vacation as you both surely deserve it. In your letter you speak of it being rather dry. It surely is far from it over here having rained every day for about a week and a half. The mud is awful & it is quite chilly as the sun never gets through the clouds to warm up the air.

The fruit orchards over here are loaded down & we have lots of fresh fruit to eat besides all sorts of nuts, which are beginning to ripen so you see we won't starve.

Say folks if you have a little

In your letter you asked

mention the number as they are
very particular about the men-
tion of divisional numbers in
letters. You probably have heard
of us in the papers as it is an
Illinois division & was commen-
ded by Pershing & several other
