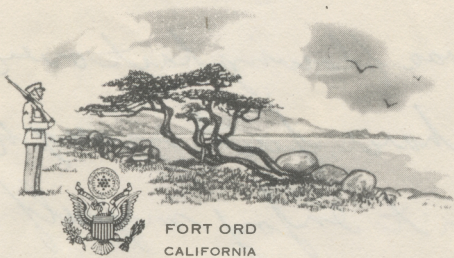

of me. the only thing I don't like about the army is
being away from you. I'm always thinking about
what you are doing at difrent times of the day. I
suppose you mite be at the dance rite now.

If I was home now all I'd do is be anxious
for the week end. That's all I was doing before I joined.
Here I'm kept so damn busy I can't keep track of
the days.

I was on K.P tonite when I got your letter
I had to work for an hour and a half before I could
read it. I got back here at 8. I could have got to
the show but I wanted to rite to you instead.
"Rampin and the shaw god" is on tonite. I went to
a good show Sunday nite. I forgot the name of it.

We got freedom of the post Sunday morning. I
went to confession and communion. In the
afternoon we went to the the big Laiders Club

over on the beach. That's about the nicest
place I ever saw. The beer was flowing fast over
there. of course I drank my share. Just enough
to ~~feel~~ feel good. But I didn't enjoy myself
They played records like, "blue stay away from me"
"letters have no arms" "Remember me" and that good
old "blue shirt Walter" and lots of others on the
Nicolodion. It made me so terribly lonesome for
you I just didn't know what to do. I would have
felt better to stay here and write you a long letter.
