Dear sweetheart,

I got my order today, but don't
much more. lat. I move over
to the third Battalion of the 22nd
Infantry Regiment. That's about
4 blocks from here. Almost all
the guys got the far East command.
I was one out of about 15 to go to
the 22nd. I'm still hoping I can stay
in the states.

I got a letter from you, But & Ma
today. It sure was nice to get
a bit of mail for once. I guess all
three of you are pretty anxious to
see me. (the two bit bad point dried up)

I was an K P tonite and I'll have it
all day tomorrow. I still had to take
time to write you a short letter anyway.
It's hard to tell when I'll be coming
home now. It could be that I stay

at least 22nd for as long as 2 or 3 months. I don't know any more about it than you do.

Well darling I guess that's all I'll write for now. I think I'd best get to bed now & I'll write you over the week end, but I slept late and so went to bed a bit later than I should have done.

I don't know what to say about the things I do in the army, just don't believe them. You're the only girl I have ever loved & I'll love you all my life.

I still think that we are better off that I'm in the army. If I was still home it would be harder on both of us.

It was mostly because of you that I did join. Of course we weren't figuring on a war were we?

Well good nite sweet heart, I love you and hope to see you soon. I write again soon
all my love, Joe
