I am sending you a few of the scholarship letters. Would you write notes on them to some people you know who may be interested in contributing?

As you know, Mr. Paepcke feels that any scholarship activity will have to come from the faculty and me. He is very adverse to the whole scholarship idea. The young lady you heard in Texas, Helen Wells of Ft. Worth, who had \$200 to spend wrote that her former teacher had invited her to come to Paris for a year to live and study. Whereupon Mr. Paepcke said--well, you see, they've got the money for study if they want to use it--which is his feeling about all of the students, that they can pay if they want to. Of course, my experience doesn't follow this and I have a deep interest in helping young students, which he has not.

Do you recall Vera Travis? What about her for a student?

Thank you for writing me soon about students and scholarships.
