I sure wish I could take you, but I guess we will have to wait awhile. Honey I Love you more and more every day if that is possible.

Sweet I received a Box of Candy from your parents today. It was mailed before I left made. It sure had done some travelling too. ~~to~~ But it was still good.

Honey did you ever receive the cable gram that I sent you when you were in the Hospital and the one



that I sent you for your Birthday? I would like to know and also I want to figure how long it takes for one to go through.

Honey I got a big kick out of your little incident where the calf butted you down. Did you get any cow sh-t on your Hank <sup>the</sup>? You better be careful around Cattle Honey, they can hurt you bad, and I sure wouldn't want anything to happen to you my Sweet.

Sweetheart I am simply too tired to write tonight, So Bye for now.
