darling, sitting in this lonely tent  
and doing the thing I love best of all  
now that I can't be with you. The next  
best thing to having you in my arms,  
is having my pen writing to you.

Honey the war is really going our  
way now. For the first time in modern  
history the Germans are feeling the real  
effect of an invading army. Some of  
them act like they are glad to see us, others  
are very indifferent. For the most part  
they are very similar to the Americans.  
They dress like us and are now like  
us in the way they build their houses  
and towns than any other place we  
have been. They certainly don't represent  
or have the appearance of anything like  
supermen to me. They are just  
a common looking sort of people.



Honey I still haven't heard from Ed yet.  
 Be sure to let me know if you should  
 hear how he is from myself or anyone,  
 I wish I could hear from him.

Haven't heard from Harry yet, in fact  
 I haven't had any mail in a week now.  
 We are moving faster than the mail  
 these days. I will sure be glad when  
 it catches up, cause Honey I want a letter  
 from you. Caring I Love you with  
 all my heart. You all have in the  
 world. I want you for all my life Honey,  
 you are all that I shall ever need, but  
 of course I would like a few additions  
 to the family. If they are just like you  
 I will be very happy. Because I think  
 you are the most wonderful person  
 in the world. You are sure Cute Honey,  
 your Blond Hair just sets off the lights  
 in those Big Brown Eyes. I Love you.



Honey I am even beginning to think that  
 our prayers may soon be answered,  
 How the Krauts manage to keep fighting  
 I don't know. But they sure haven't  
 quit yet. I was reading a piece in the  
 paper about the war being over, but it  
 hasn't happened yet. God knows we are  
 all praying that it will be soon.  
 ah honey would it be wonderful when  
 we can be together again for the  
 rest of our lives then we can have  
 our own home and start to raise  
 that family that we have always  
 wanted.
