I am now quite certain however that we will not leave here before Tuesday & maybe not then. I will say however that if they want to have anyone in on the proposed parade in Chicago they better shoot us along "tootsweet" as the majority are about tired of waiting after getting this close & are just naturally hopping on a train & going home. I think however that we will be in Chicago Thursday. The papers will probably tell you definitely before then so I will be looking for you.

There is practically no restriction on us now & I have made several trips to the big city & have gotten so I know the downtown
