Never, since I arrived here have I felt as elated as I am now. Really, Mom, every time I get a letter from home and hear that everything is alright and every body is doing fine, I feel as happy as a two year old. You see even tho I am far away from home my thoughts are with you folks constantly, and every time I hear from home it relieves me very much to know that you don't worry about me too much.

The boil I had on my chin is almost gone and I am my usual self now. Feel very good and expect to stay that way. The last letter I wrote wasn't a very cheery one so don't let it bother you. I hadn't been feeling very well when I wrote it and it probably didn't sound as cheery as it should have so now you will know why it wasn't a

very good one.

Now for a few words about my new nephew. Every word that is written about him I read seven or eight times. I know that I didn't sound as glad in my previous letters as I should have but I really am proud Mom, that we have a little boy in our family now. I know that Pa would have been just as proud as I am were he here to see him. But that is in the past now and we will have to make up to Dennis George for all the adoration and blessings that Pa would ^{have} showered on him. Am awaiting the pictures of him that Mary is sending. From all reports of him, he must really be cute. I too, sincerely hope that I will be home in time to enjoy his baby antics. Bet that you are proud that you are Grandmother to a fine baby boy like Dennis George.
