Really was glad to hear the news about Ed Liz. That kind of had me worried for awhile, but I guess that every thing will be alright now.

Received a letter from Mrs Roberts with a M.O. enclosed. Why the influx of money. I have

enough here to satisfy my wants.

I still feeling fine except that my blood has turned bad on me. Have had two boils in succession on my chin and it is aggravating to monkey around with the pesky things. Am watching my diet now and don't expect to have any trouble in the future.

By the way, the letter with the pictures came the same day as your V-mail letter of the 19<sup>th</sup>.
