Robert Frelly, Music Director and Conductor of The Chapman University Wind Ensemble, is high recognized in the Southland as an accomplished conductor and music educator. He is currently an Assistant Professor within the School of Music at Chapman University where he also serves as Director of Music Education. Additionally, he is the Founder and Music Director/Conductor of the Orange County Junior Orchestra and Associate Conductor of the Orange County Youth Symphony Orchestra. His professional conducting positions have included a four-year tenure as Assistant Conductor of the Long Beach Symphony Orchestra, and Music Director and Conductor of the Southern California Pops Orchestra. He has conducted for films and has worked with many jazz and pop music artists, including Doc Severinsen, Bill Conti, and Skitch Hendersen.

Dr. Frelly holds a Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Southern California and a Master of Music in Instrumental Conducting from California State University, Long Beach, where he was inducted as a member of the Graduate Dean's List of University Scholars and Artists. He also holds dual Bachelor of Music degrees in Music Education and Music Composition from Chapman University and is a published composer. He has served in various capacities with and performed clinics and workshops for numerous local and regional arts organizations, including the Orange County Music Educators Association, the Southern California School Band and Orchestra Association, and the California Music Educators Association. At present, Dr. Frelly is a member of the Board of Directors of the American Symphony Orchestra League, a national arts organization for the advancement of orchestras in the United States.
