Haven't heard from you since I received the Easter cards last week. Am expecting some mail in a few days so I am not worried about that.

The Easter cards were very nice and believe me, I appreciated receiving them. The pictures were the most delightful surprise I have had in quite awhile. They were swell and I think that I will keep them all, that is if you don't mind. Mom looks alright but I was worried until your letter had told me she had her hair set. It made her look a little different than I expected her to look. The baby looks cute in the pictures, especially the one on the sofa with his lips all puckered up. No kidding, Mary, he really is a darling. Diane looks great, but Gosh she sure is growing up. Better get this war over in a hurry or I'll be coming home in time to watch her graduate from grammar school.

Want to tell you again how much I appreciate the things you have sent

me. The moccasins and flashlight are a lifesaver to me. If for some reason I had to part with either of the two it would cause me much discomfort. The flints are lasting fairly well and since they came my worries about lighting cigarettes have ceased.

Still in tip top shape and getting along okay. Was quite busy for the last few days so I didn't get a chance to write until now.

Wrote a letter to this girl Terry that Mom knows. Don't forget to let me know what you think of her.

Sent a camera home last week so you can expect it shortly after you receive this letter. Still trying to get a few more articles before I send the other things home.

Just like me to forget to mention the poems in the Easter cards. They were very nice and I know that they were meant in all sincerity.
