That paragraph about that Sunday dinner had me drooling at the mouth. When I think of all those lovely dinners I had at your home I not only feel homesick but hungry.

Havent been receiving any V. Mail lately but you never know what might happen to it. A big batch of mail came in today but it hasn't as yet been distributed. I'm about due for a big bunch of Daily Times. That paper sure makes good reading material. I read them from the front to the back. I don't miss a thing about what is going on in Shi.

That was nice of you and Mom to go to

the cemetery. I think of Pa quite often and I too wonder what he would say if he was still with us. I know that he would be tickled pink with his two grand children and the very fine husband that his daughter has. He always was proud of how smart you were and why not?
