Received your letter of the 9<sup>th</sup>  
several days ago but was pretty  
busy so I was unable to write until  
now. <sup>a fellow</sup> <sup>main</sup> <sup>sent</sup> <sup>home</sup>

Glad to know that you heard  
from Dick C. again. He must  
have written a very nice letter  
from what you write. I enjoyed  
his company very much and above  
all really enjoyed talking to him.  
Even tho he didn't have much  
education, he was very intelligent  
and could talk about any thing.

He had some sort of knowledge  
about any subject I could bring up  
and now that he is gone I miss  
the talks we used to have.

Things are going alright with me and my health is still in fine shape. Begin to work in earnest starting Monday. Have been resting for awhile and I am not in perfect condition, but it won't take long to rectify that.

This place that I am now living in is beautiful. Really Mary, the view here is terrific. The Pacific Ocean is about two hundred yards from my bunk. I lay on my bunk and <sup>watch</sup> the breakers come rolling in and pound against the rocky shoreline. The water is crystal clear and looking down from one of the bluffs you can see the various, beautifully colored coral rocks on the bottom. Then a rainbow colored fish about 18 inches long will go darting by or a school of fish

# I will be playing tag nearby. all in all it makes for a very nice broviac area, the nicest one I have been in since I left the states.

Glad you are going house hunting next spring. With things the way they are it may seem like a big risk to take but please remember, I'll be right in there with the two of you helping in every and any way I can. About my future, well that can take care of itself and as far as I can see it doesn't include a wife for at least the next three years. It may sound funny to you but I have changed quite a few of my former viewpoints and that is one of them.
