I'm a little late in writing this letter but as usual I have a good excuse. I have been pretty busy lately and it looks like I will continue to be busy. You see Mom, out here we don't have a eight hour day to work. We are available twenty four hours a day and many a time we work eight hours, sleep eight, then right back to work we go. It doesn't happen often so we don't mind it much. It does upset our daily routine somewhat and of course we don't have much leisure time in which to write home. I hope that you're not hearing from me hasn't upset you. I wish you and Mary wouldn't worry about me because my letters don't come very regularly. You know the old saying "no news is good news". If in the future something like this should happen ^{again} don't worry Mom, it's just because I haven't the time. Hope that this will explain my long silence to you satisfactorily.

Now for something else, I bought those two necklace sets like you asked and as soon as possible I'll send them to you. It would be easier for you to give them to the priest's wife and Mrs Roberts, than sending separate parcels. Hope you like them.

Mary asked me a thousand questions in her last eight letters. I'll try to answer them sometime in the future.

Havent as yet received any of the packages but I expect them very shortly. I received a package, filled with different kinds of candy from Helen Ashbrenner but that is the only one so far.

Was sorry to hear about Allen. It sure must have been tough on him losing his buddies that way. It sounds as if he had been thru some very bad experiences.

Glud to hear that the children are feeling better. By the way, you take it nice and easy in the future, Mom, I want you to be home when this is all over, dont forget your my one and only Mom.
