If they won't give me the time off then do you suppose I ought to quit? I shall see what's what when the time comes.

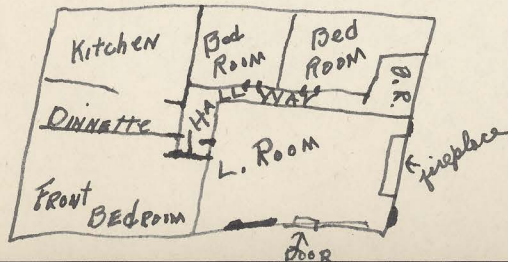
