Ever since I founded my chamber symphony about five years ago, I have been a favorite target of the Goldberg Arlen team. After your arrival I briefly entertained the hope that a little of your professional integrity might rub off on the associates you inherited. Yesterday's review makes it clear that, to the contrary, all remaining restraints have been thrown to the winds.

Arlen's review is more than an attack on me personally. It is a naked attempt to discredit and destroy the achievement of the many good people whose unselfish efforts have made it possible to give this community its only chamber orchestra.

It seems a pity that a sincere creative effort should meet with such persistent and unreasoning hostility.
