I weep with you as I read "The Government and the Arts" in today's Times. I am even more saddened when, in the absence of government support, our urgent need for local support remains unrecognized. And I am concerned over the lack of any announcement in the Music News column of our forthcoming loth anniversary season, with the opening event only three weeks away.

Your July 11 news item relegating the California Chamber Symphony to suburbia and questioning its concern for authenticity has hurt us. The new chamber group has eagerly picked it up, reprinted it, and saturated the community with it.
