The paranoia of the Temianka camp vs. the Marriner camp is beginning to amuse me. Page one coverage is often a matter of space availability as well as an implied judgment of the importance of any event. We try to place any concert of exceptional interest -- i.e., a seasonal opening or important debut or extraordinary repertory -- in that prominent position. We are, unfortunately, not always successful.

Your memory, in any case, is faulty. The California Chamber Symphony was last reviewed on page one -- by me -- on February 9th of this year. The occasion was the local premiere of the Shostakovich 14th Symphony.

Now what was that about a credibility gap?
