I'm back in my own department again. It doesn't matter one bit to me where they put me. Just so I get paid. I think it's very definite now that we are going on 10 hours a day. But we are only going to work 5 days a week. We have Sunday off and one more day. I suppose after we get used to it, it wont [sic] be so bad.

I did sleep home last night. I don't know what happened to the newlyweds. They weren't at Babich's either. I suppose they went to Cleveland or someplace. But thier [sic] clothes and stuff are still at the apartment. I'll have to take it to Babich's. I told them before hand that I wanted the apartment back Thursday.

Last night I had supper at Bathory's. I was comming [sic] from town and I saw Mrs Bathory so I picked her up. and she asked me to stop in and then her and Margery insisted I stay for supper so I did and we had veal paprikash You know, like chicken paprikash only this was veal and it was very good.
