## CU To Participate in Nationwide Global Warming Teach-In on Jan. 31

**ORANGE, Calif., Jan. 18, 2008 --** Chapman University will be one of more than 1,100 colleges, universities, high schools, middle schools, places of worship, businesses and organizations nationwide to participate in Focus the Nations national teach-in on global warming, to be held on Thursday, Jan. 31. Our intent is to move America beyond fatalism to a determination to face up to this civilizational challenge, the challenge of our generation, states the nonprofit educational and advocacy organization (see much more at [www.focusthenation.org](http://www.focusthenation.org)).

Chapmans event will be a debate on global warming issues between Timothy Canova, the School of Laws associate dean for academic affairs and Betty Hutton Williams Professor of International Economic Law; and Donald J. Kochan, associate professor of law, on Thursday, January 31 at 12 noon in Room 237 Kennedy Hall. The debate is open to the university community and the public, free of charge.
