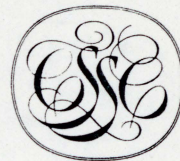

I look forward to taking you to lunch at the Algonquin on Monday, April 13, and shall call you that morning to ascertain what is the most convenient time for you. In the meantime I enclose a copy of my birthday celebration program which may amuse you.

I also am sending you, under separate cover, a cassette of my earliest recordings, which Keith Hardwick of EMI has just remastered. Other recordings in the planned reissues are all LP stereos and include 15 Handel Sonatas (with Malcolm Hamilton, Everest), several Paganini Quartet recordings, including Ravel and late Beethoven (RCA), and my Dvorak and Tchaikovsky recordings of the past decade.
