

I got letters from Chuck and Bill today. Sure was nice to hear from them Chuck says he knows his way around London pretty well now. He says it's a swell town. In one of my letters I asked him if anything was hard for him to get. He said that he was only allowed two 5 [c] candy bars a week so I'm going to try and get a box to send him.

Bill said that he got his invitation for a screening test. I sure hope he [Page 3 – Letter continued] doesn't have to go.
