Children's Center Offers Summer Programs

ORANGE, Calif., Mar. 29, 2004 Street dance, filmmaking and cartooning are just a sampling of the fun and creative activities elementary age children are offered at this summer's Camp Chapman and College for Kids. The summer recreation programs organized by the Children's Center at Chapman University emphasize self-discovery and provide opportunities to develop new interests, abilities and friendships.



Camp Chapman is a two-week day camp with activities and field trips for children entering the first through sixth grades. Students participate in arts and crafts projects, swimming, barbeques and field trips to Wild Rivers and Disneyland. Camp Chapman runs from 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., June 14-18 and June 21-25.

College for Kids offers children entering first through sixth grades one hour classes in a variety of special interests including ceramics, math, sign language and karate. All classes are taught by professional school teachers and university students specializing in particular skill areas. Youngsters are offered three classes, in one hour installments, to complete their morning schedules. The center has two College for Kids sessions; the first session takes place June 28-July 23, and the second session occurs July 26-August 13.
