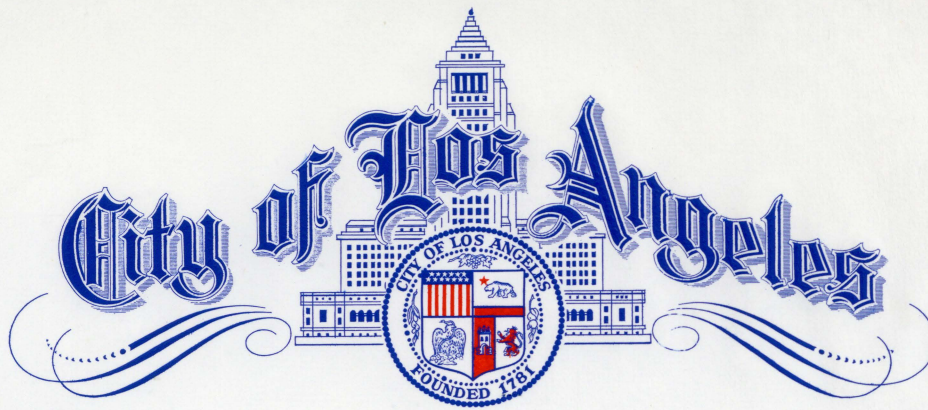

Dear Maestro Temianka:


