I am most happy to inform you that I am staging two productions of NOYE'S FLUDIE in Los Angeles on December 10th, afternoon and evening, under the auspices of my California Fund for Music. The afternoon performance will be for children and the evening performance will be for an adult audience.

In view of the importance we attach to this first full scale performance in the City of Los Angeles, I would appreciate a personal message from you.

I would also be grateful for any advice you can give me on the basis of the experience you have gained in the three years since the work was written. For instance, you have stated that there should not be less than 25 players in the orchestra. But what is the maximum number of players that can be profitably used? I want to involve as many performers as possible, without making the orchestra top-heavy. I kwould also like to use a larger number of bugles. Please let me have your views on this.
