
I note that you will be in Europe this autumn and would like to have a meeting to discuss a project with me. Unfortunately this time is completely impossible for me. I am 'up to my eyes' in professional work and have to spend the month of October either in hospital or recovering from a minor operation. I am sorry to have to write this and you will understand, I know, that only a very difficult situation would compel me to do it. Perhaps you could write a little more fully as to what your project really is. I would remind you, however, that I spend a great deal of time these days recording my own works in what should be an authoritative version. I do not see that I can do more than notate my music as accurately as possible, and provide as many personal recordings that I have time for; but if you have other suggestions I would be most interested to learn what they are as I am sure they will be most sympathetic.
